5th Sunday in Easter - April 28th, 2024

Bishop Robert Barron, in this homily for the 5th Sunday of Easter Year B, emphasizes the intimate and organic relationship between Jesus and us, as illustrated by the vine and branches analogy. He highlights that this connection is not merely instructional but life-giving, where Jesus desires to live His life through us. This relationship is nurtured through the sacraments, which are means by which Jesus shares His life with us. Barron encourages seeing our lives as vehicles for Christ to act in the world today, including being a friend to sinners, a healer, a teacher of the Kingdom, and embracing suffering as participation in Jesus' redeeming work.
