
ICPM LUNCH

Marguerite d'Youville, the first native Canadian to be elevated to sainthood, was born October 15, 1701 at Varennes, Quebec. She was the eldest of six children. Her father died when she was seven years old leaving this family of six in great poverty. Through the influence of her great-grandfather, she was able to study for two years at the Ursulines in Quebec. Upon returning home, she became an invaluable support to her mother and undertook the education of her brothers and sisters.



She married François de'Youville in 1722. She soon realized that her husband had no interest in making a home life which caused her great suffering. She was pregnant with her sixth child when François became seriously ill and she cared for him until his death in 1730. By age 29, she had experienced great poverty and suffered the loss of her father, husband and four of her children.

In all these sufferings Marguerite grew in her belief of God's presence in her life. She in turn, undertook many charitable works with complete trust in God. Marguerite was soon joined by three young women dedicated to caring for the poor.

Marguerite always championed the rights of the poor despite the ridicule and obstacles which she faced. She became the director of the Charon Brothers Hospital in Montreal which was falling into ruin. With the help of her sisters they rebuilt the hospital and cared for those in need. Later the hospital was destroyed by fire but Marguerite's spirit and faith in God gave her the courage to continue with her mission. At the age of 64 she undertook the reconstruction of this shelter for the poor. Exhausted from a life-time of self-giving, Marguerite died on December 23, 1771 and will be remembered as a loving mother who served Jesus in the poor.

Today, her mission is carried on in a spirit of hope by the Sisters of Charity of Montreal, "Grey Nuns." They serve in almost every continent.

Marguerite was beautified by Pope John XXIII on May 3, 1959 and was canonized in 1990.

St. Luke


Feast Day October 18

On October 18 Catholics and other Christians celebrate the feast of St. Luke, the physician and companion of St. Paul. St. Luke wrote a greater volume of the New Testament than any other single author in the history of the Church. Luke's writings incorporate the personal testimony of the Blessed Virgin Mary. He is also the founder of Christian iconography. Tradition credits him with painting several icons of the Virgin Mary. One of the portraits ascribed by Luke named "Salvation of the Roman People" survives to this day in the Basilica of St. Mary Major.

It is not clear if Luke became a disciple before or after Jesus' ascension. After St. Paul's conversion Luke accompanied him as his personal physician and, in effect, as a kind of biographer since the journeys of Paul on which Luke accompanied him occupy a large portion of the Acts of the Apostles.

Luke was also among the only companions of Paul who did not abandon him during his final imprisonment and death in Rome. After the martyrdom of St. Paul in the year 67, St. Luke is said to have preached elsewhere throughout the Mediterranean and possibly died a martyr.

St. Luke is the patron saint of: artists, bachelors, bookbinders, brewers, butchers, doctors, glass makers, glassworkers, gold workers, goldsmiths, lace makers, notaries, painters, physicians, sculptors, stained glass workers, surgeons.
