The challenges faced by so many of our brothers and sisters both around here in Edmonton and around the world may seem remote, and the issues may seem overwhelming and insurmountable. On this Sunday, Solidarity Sunday, we are reminded that we are all connected. We are one human family whatever our varied national, racial, ethnic, economic, and ideological background. We are our brothers' and sisters' keepers, wherever they may be. "Love your neighbour as yourself," a quote found both in the Old Testament (Leviticus 19:18) and the New Testament (Mark 12:31) is a call to transform our lives: what do we know about the root causes of the social problems, here in Edmonton, in Canada, and around the world? What can be done with others, not just for others, to address these causes, effect transformation, and ensure that everyone matters, everyone has dignity? The work is challenging but ever more imperative, and it can be accomplished one small step at a time.

A good step: learn and understand a little more how we can make a difference. There are many sources available; a few links are provided for your reading.

Another step: have hope and do not be discouraged. Jesus tells us in the well-known parable of the Final Judgement (Matthew 25: 31-46) that even the seeming least things we do to help can have lasting benefit.

# 5th Sunday in Lent, March 17, 2024

In the gospel for the 5th Sunday of Lent Year B, Jesus speaks of his upcoming death and the necessity of it. He tells his followers that unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a single grain. But if it dies, it produces much fruit. Jesus is using this analogy to explain that his death will bear much fruit. His death will bring salvation to all who believe in him. But he is also telling his followers that following him requires sacrifice. We must be willing to let go of our own



desires and wills and follow the will of God.

This can be a difficult and painful process, just as it was for Jesus on the cross. Jesus himself had to

surrender his own will and desires to the will of the Father. He had to endure the pain and suffering of the cross to accomplish the Father's plan of salvation. But through this sacrifice, Jesus brought great glory to God. His death and resurrection brought salvation to all who believe in him. And his life and teachings continue to inspire and transform countless lives.

Through our own sacrifices, we too can bear much fruit and bring glory to God. Our sacrifice may not be as dramatic as that of Jesus, but it is still important. It may involve giving up our time, talents, or resources to serve others. It may involve forgiving someone who has hurt us. It may involve putting the needs of others before our own.

Whatever form our sacrifice takes, we can be assured that it will bear fruit. It will bring glory to God and help to build his kingdom on earth. So let us be willing to follow Jesus, even when it requires sacrifice. Let us be willing to let go of our own desires and wills, and follow the will of God.






Feast of St. Joseph March 19, 2024



welcoming gesture. The Gospel readings recount the story of Jesus' death and Passion, evoking reflection on His sacrificial love and the profound significance of Holy Week. You can reflect on this passage by reading the Gospel of Mark Chapter 11, verses 1-11.


